

YOUTH SKI PROGRAM

This is the 4th year of our Youth Nordic Ski program for skiers aged 4-17. Last year, we had 17 young skiers participate in lessons, and we're hoping to add a few more this year. We are again able to lend skis to any kids who need them for the winter season and will be purchasing some new equipment soon.

This year, we will meet once a week on Thursdays (5:00-6:00 pm) at Meacham Divide Nordic Ski Area during January and February. Skiers will be placed into groups by ability to learn classic skiing technique (advanced skiers may also learn skating technique). Parents are welcome to join in or take the opportunity to leave their kids with us and ski on their own. The cost per skier is \$25 for 8 lessons. Proceeds go to BMNC to offset costs for kids' skis, volunteer instructors, and to organize a fun "race" and BBQ at the end of the season.

There were two periods where the jet stream was such that Meacham received a large amount of snow with cold conditions, resulting in excellent skiing. During those times we groomed every few days. You may also remember that there were two periods of 2-3 weeks each where it did not snow (or it rained), and we did not groom.



Mark Hodgson and Sons, Inc. has provided the equipment and skilled drivers needed to plow the road and parking lot since the trails were developed 20 years ago. 
BMNC INFORMATION

For our snowshoeing friends: When possible, diagonal ski tracks will only be set on one side of the trails at Meacham Divide, leaving the middle area for skaters and the other side for snowshoeing. No walkers, runners, sled-haulers (but kid pulks are allowed and encouraged), or bikers on the trails, please! And remember to check out the new Snowshoe Hare trail, which offers some great views of the Elkhorns and passes through some old-growth forest on relatively flat ground.



MEMBERSHIP

Your membership pays for our Oregon Nordic Club affiliation, which provides liability insurance for the ski area and the groomer and hosts the website. We would not exist without it! Additionally, your dues enable us to plan ahead for grooming opportunities. We have many other expenses beyond insurance, such as a La Grande P.O. box, property taxes and insurance on the pole barn where the grooming machine and club supplies are stored, stamps for our newsletter, and fuel and parts for the groomer.

CONDITIONS REPORT

Check the BMNC website at onc.org/bmnc/ for current snow and road conditions of the FS Road 31 into the ski parking lot and ODOT's TRIPCHECK (<https://www.tripcheck.com>) for I-84 road conditions. If you are a current member you will receive email updates about trail and road conditions. Be sure to check your spam folder if you don't hear from us after you become a member. AND we won't share your email address with anyone.

DOGS: YES! (AND NO)

Dogs are allowed on all trails below Moose Huff Hill (Lower Loppet, Kansas, I Scream, Roller Coaster, Whitman Whip and Pendleton Plunge, Snowshoe Hare), providing a diverse set of trail conditions to enjoy with your canine friends. However, all trails above Moose Huff Hill have a “no dog” policy. These conditions arose from a landowner request on our outer loop trails, and the fact that many of our members would like to ski (and skate) in a dog-free zone. (For skate skiing in particular, dog tracks can ruin a carefully groomed trail). If you encounter skiers with dogs above Moose Huff, please politely inform them about the rules; there are plenty of trails available for canids lower down!



ABOUT MEACHAM DIVIDE

Meacham Divide Nordic Ski Area is located 1.7 miles northeast of Interstate 84 on Forest Service Road 31 (Mount Emily, Exit 243) between Pendleton and La Grande in the Blue Mountains. The Blue Mountain Nordic Club (BMNC) offers 18 kilometers (about 10 miles) of groomed ski trails at Meacham, with varying levels of difficulty. At 4,100 feet in elevation and with expansive views of the 1,400-foot deep Meacham Canyon and Spout Springs Ridgeline, Meacham Divide offers great skiing - both classic and freestyle - and snowshoeing for all ages and abilities. There's no better ski area when conditions are good in the Blue Mountains!
